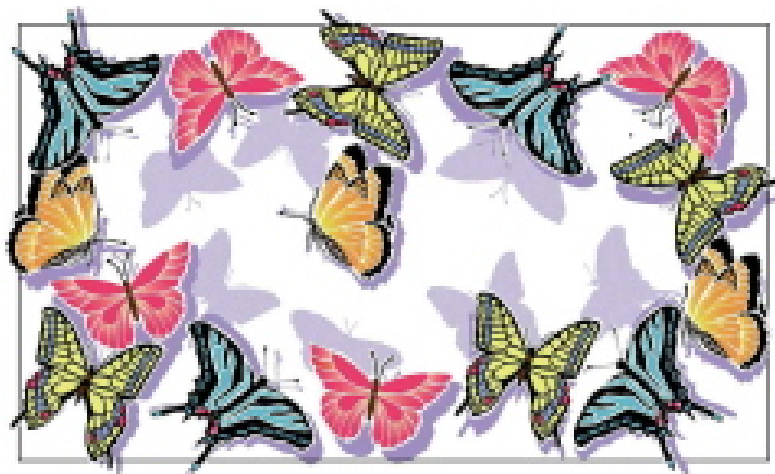

We are here to remember and honor the 15 people who tragically lost their life and the many others whose lives were forever changed as a result of the March 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2005 BP Texas City plant explosion.

We are here to remember commitments made by many of us five years ago. For BCA, it was promises to our clients to be aggressive and thorough in discovering the root causes of this tragedy. Promises to the general public to disclose all the results of our independent investigations. Promises of spreading awareness in order to improve safety conditions for all industrial plants so that tragedies such as this may be prevented in the future. For the USW and safety organizations, it was a promise to work with the industry to use this information to make petrochemical facilities a safer place to work. And for all of us, it was to leave this tragedy with lessons learned and make sure they are never forgotten.

On this, the fifth year anniversary of the Texas City plant explosion, we are here together to commemorate those who lost their life and take a look back at what progress has been made. These promises and the calls for action that followed, for all the lives that were touched, will never be broken.


When news of the horrific tragedy of the BP Texas City Refinery explosion reached us that fateful day in March of 2005, we could never have guessed the personal impact and loss that it would mean for our small community. It was a day where the bad news got worse as the day went on: there's been an explosion, people have been killed, James and Linda were working there, they are missing. The words still send chills down my spine. These were people we know! They lived here, Linda worked with us, we had watched Jeremy and Eva grow up right here in our school. Heartbroken doesn't even begin to describe how we felt as a staff. The tears flowed freely. The weeks and months that followed were filled with sadness as we watched Jeremy and Eva have to do something that no children should ever have to do: bury not one, but both parents. The word "why" kept resounding.

Time marched on, as it always does. Seasons changed. We went on about our business of educating kids. Then, we faced news that was completely opposite in nature—it was the good news. Eva didn't accept the settlement, Eva is fighting BP, Eva has won....and then, Eva is gifting Hornbeck High School graduates. In a school where just over 50 percent of our students are on free or reduced fee lunches, can you imagine what kind of news this was? As sad and as tragic as the loss was, the news that our graduating seniors would receive assistance to further their education was incredible. Again, the tears flowed freely, but this time, for joy!
